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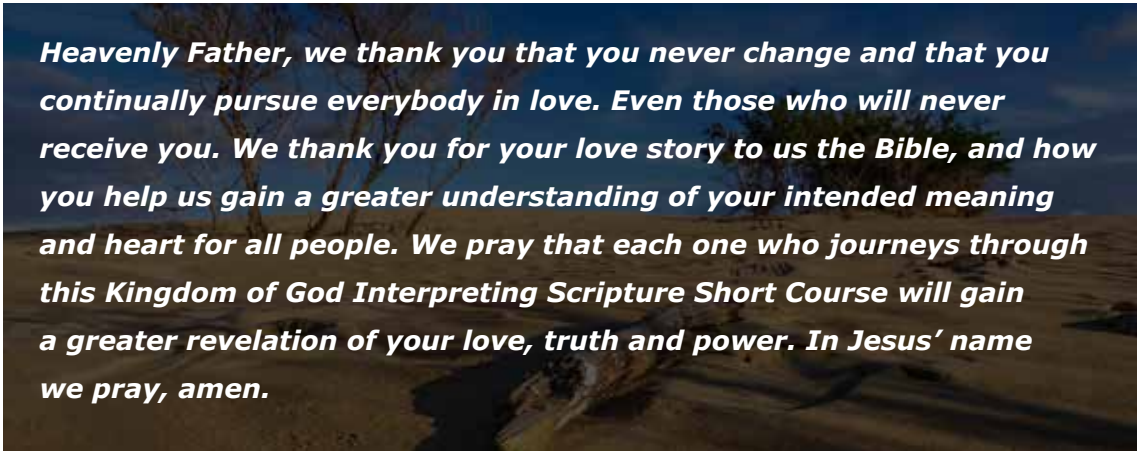

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## Prophets Part 2

Recapping from Part 1, the role of the prophet in the Old Testament was to speak for God regarding His covenant relationship with the Ancient Israelites and His will for all people.

In Isaiah 49, we read that God refers to Israel as His servant in whom He will be glorified. And how God chose Israel, that is the descendants of Abraham as part of fulfilling His eternal plan. In reading Isaiah 42, we discovered that the promise to Abraham and his descendants was that they would be a blessing to all people. This promise is fulfilled in the Servant who is the Messiah and saviour of the world.


We will now continue our journey to discover how the servant Messiah fulfils the calling and promise given to Abraham and his descendants. Let's discover who the Messiah, the saviour of the world is, the one who fulfils these promises. We'll read several passages of scripture from the Gospel of Jesus according to Luke.

Read **Luke 1:54-55**

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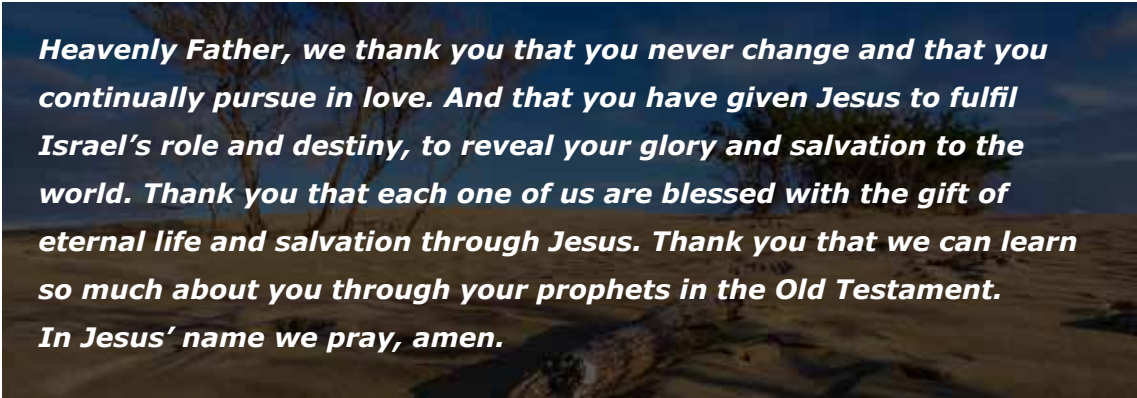

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## Frequently asked questions

*Given that the main role of the prophet in the Old Testament was to speak to the Ancient Israelites on behalf of God, can we take the promises given to them and apply them to our lives? For example, Jeremiah 29:11 says, For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, says the LORD, thoughts of peace and not of evil, to give you a future and a hope.*

To answer the question about whether this is a verse we can apply directly to our lives, let us do a practical together. We will read Jeremiah 29:10-14 to understand God's intended meaning of what He is saying in verse 11.

Read **Jeremiah 29:10-14**

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**Why** was it written?

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As we discovered in the Behind the Meaning video part 2, it is only when certain things are the same that we can apply a scripture directly to our lives. So let us ask, **what** are some of the things that are the same for us today?

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Even though God is the creator who is the future and hope of all people, this is a very specific word of encouragement to a people in a very specific situation. While Jeremiah 29:11 reveals God's character, that He has thoughts of peace and not of evil, God is prophesying directly to those of Jewish lineage in captivity in Babylon. He reveals that whilst they are in captivity, there will come a day when they will seek Him, find Him and be gathered together back to the land from which they were taken.

However, when the prophecies concern the Messiah, the saviour of the world, both those of Jewish and non-Jewish lineage have the opportunity to receive His deliverance, freedom and righteousness or rightness. Each one, regardless of ethnicity, has the right to receive Jesus. That is, all of who He is, all He has done and will do.

For further study on this, read Galatians 3:8-9, 16, 26-29.

In Galatians chapter 3, the Apostle Paul is speaking to those of Jewish lineage about their need to receive Jesus and His right to rule and reign in order to be part of the promise given to Abraham. He is also explaining that those of non-Jewish lineage who believe God, that is receive Jesus just as Abraham did, inherit the righteousness or rightness of God. The promise given to Abraham that all of the nations of the earth will be blessed through his seed is fulfilled in all who receive Jesus, receive God. For through the seed of Abraham came the Christ, the saviour of the world. And through receiving Jesus and His right to rule and reign, we are blessed with every spiritual blessing.

Back to Jeremiah 29:11. This verse is from a specific prophecy to those who had been taken captive to Babylon. It is referring to the LORD bringing them back to the land from which they were taken. Therefore, we cannot take this verse and change it or reinterpret it another way to apply it to our lives. However, we can know and understand God's character through this verse and the book of Jeremiah. The Ancient Israelites who were in captivity had turned their back on God and did not want to hear from Him. Yet God still loved, pursued and desired for them to be truly free.



For us today, God’s love story the Bible still speaks to us intimately and personally. However, God will never contradict Himself. For us to apply any verse or promise to our lives, it needs to align with God’s intended meaning. As we learnt in the Behind the Meaning videos, there are five key areas that affect meaning. We need to go on the journey of discovering them to understand God’s intended meaning and whether we can apply a scripture directly to our lives.
